FIRST+MAIN FILMS ANNOUNCES THE WINNING FILMS FROM THE 2020 BETTER CITIES FILM FESTIVAL

Segregated By Design wins Grand Prize, The Great Disconnect wins Best Feature Film, and Cycling Toward a Better Future wins Best Short Film.

Buffalo, NY — November 25, 2020 — Today First+Main Films announced the winning films for the 2020 Better Cities Film Festival.

The Grand Prize was awarded to *Segregated by Design*, an epic animated documentary revealing the dark history of unconstitutional US housing segregation based on Richard Rothstein's seminal book, "The Color of Law." The Best Feature Film was awarded to *The Great Disconnect*, a compelling documentary exploring the causes and solutions to today's "age of loneliness," including urban design. The Best Short Film was awarded to *Cycling Toward a Better Future*, an inspiring story about the Pikala bicycle initiative in Marrakesh, Morocco.

Film entries were judged by an international panel of esteemed urbanists, architects and filmmakers including Jan Gehl, Christopher Leinberger, Tami Door, Trinity Simons, Ethan Kent, Mick Cornett, and Rama Perparim.

In addition to the Grand Prize winners, awards were given to the following best in category films: Better Environment – *Degrowth in the Suburbs*; Better Planning & Design – *Vision 2030*; Better Transport – *Spokespeople*; Better Communities – *Good White People*; Better Economies For All – *It's Not Fair*; Better Technology & Innovation – *Starting Small*.

Special film festival awards were given to the following films: Spirit of the Festival Award – Detroit 48202; Hero Award – Motherload; Best Student Film – People's Struggle; Best Animation – Segregated by Design; Best Civic Story – Space Needle: A Hidden History; Best Human Story – Last Stop for Lost Property; Emerging Ideas Award – Working Cities Wednesdays; Best Urban Arts Award – Colosal. Space Needle: A Hidden History won the Audience Favorite award.

Awards in new categories for 2020 were: Best Architecture Film – *Instruments in the Architecture:* Building the Pianodrome ; Best Bicycle Film – There & Then: Best Housing Film – Living Patrimony; Best

Engineering Film– *Blue Goes Green*; Best Next Gen Film – *Making our Place*; Best Water Film – *L'Eau Est La Vie (Water is Life)*; Best World Games Film – *White Elephants*.

"We're proud to honor these filmmakers, who use their talent and passion to tell stories about creating better places. Their work is beautiful and poignant and reflects the Better Cities Film Festival mission to inspire and empower communities." said Dr. Chris Elisara, co-founder of First+Main Films. "During this pandemic we need these stories even more to lift our spirits and inspire us to build better places for a better future."

Because of the ongoing global pandemic, the festival transitioned to a virtual presentation. "The online format of the festival had its benefits, but we are looking forward to hosting the 2021 festival in Detroit with all our local partners." said festival director Joshua Paget. "The festival's mission is about communities, and we were glad to be able to foster community in news ways." In this community spirit, the festival donated one dollar per ticket to their local venue partner, Cinema Detroit, an independent movie theatre severely impacted by public health measures. The festival also offered revenue sharing for creators, with twenty-five percent of all ticket sales paid to filmmakers.

First+Main Films will extend the festival's impact by enabling civic groups and organizations to host a Better Cities Film Festival *Best of Fest* screening in their own town. "This year's winning films will be shown in cities across the globe, providing communities everywhere with inspiration and ideas to become better places." said John Paget, co-founder of First+Main Films.
